The volunteers are each assigned a child considering whether the student is capable of teaching the child respective of the grade he/she is currently studying in and the student is responsible for helping the child overcome problems by conducting weekly tests and using methods which are easier for the children to memorize and grasp. PRAYAS not only focuses on studies but also development of children via extracurricular activities and events for overall development of the children. Once in a year children are taken to a mall or supermarket to buy anything of their choice resulting in heartfelt smiles. The importance of festivals and the excitement to celebrate them is also taken into consideration by organizing various functions where different games and activities are conducted. Every year an annual function is held to celebrate the achievements of the students and to provide them a stage to showcase their talents.
